CONCEPT NOTE

BACKGROUND

12th Anniversary of the January 24th HWPL Peace Day

Chairman Lee Man-hee, the founder of HWPL, travelled the world 33 times from 2013 to 2024 reaching out to current and former heads of states, political and religious leaders, youth and women representatives, and people from the field of education. He visited the Philippines more than 8 times and contributed to the peace building efforts in Mindanao starting with the January 24, 2014 Mindanao Peace Agreement between Gov. Esmael Mangudadatu and Archbishop Fernando Capalla. This symbolizes the beginning of spreading HWPL's peace initiatives throughout Mindanao, and eventually, across the entire country of the Philippines.

In January 2015, to commemorate the 1st anniversary of this peace agreement, January 24th was declared by the Province of Maguindanao as the HWPL Peace Day and the 1st HWPL peace monument was established in Buluan, Maguindanao, Philippines.

In order to continuously spread HWPL's peace initiatives across Mindanao, the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF), through the leadership of Chairman Al-Haj Murad Ebrahim who is now the Chief Minister of BARMM, established the 2nd HWPL peace monument in Camp Darapanan and confirmed January 24th as the HWPL Peace Day. Since then, January 24th became a significant day for the global family of peace of HWPL.

In addition, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a resolution on December 3, 2018 proclaiming January 24th as the International Day of Education, in celebration of the role of education in bringing global peace and sustainable development.



■ PURPOSE

Through an event celebrating the 12th anniversary of this groundbreaking achievement, we aim to raise awareness around the world of the HWPL Peace Day that is celebrated every year on January 24th and calling out the support of Philippines for Declaration of Peace and Cessation of War (DPCW). It will be an opportunity to renew the hope and spirit of peace among people around the world who are currently experiencing various violence and conflicts. We will focus on spreading the culture of peace and unity by empowering the youth to be peace ambassadors of our nation.

■ THEME: *Youth Rise Up for Peace and Unity through Interfaith Dialogue!*

As the world continues to face conflicts rooted in misunderstanding, intolerance, and religious division, the role of the youth becomes increasingly vital. Young people are not only inheritors of today's challenges but are also powerful agents of change capable of shaping a future anchored in peace, coexistence, and mutual respect.

Recognizing this, HWPL continues to strengthen its Alliance of Religions initiative through the Religious Peace Academy (RPA)—a structured peace education platform that promotes deeper understanding of religious teachings, common values, and ethical principles that uphold peace and unity across faiths.

The 12th Anniversary of January 24 HWPL Peace Day highlights the youth's crucial role in advancing interfaith harmony and cultivating a culture of peace, empowering them to rise as peace advocates within their communities, institutions, and nations.

■ OBJECTIVES

1. Empower the youth to actively participate in peacebuilding through education and interfaith dialogue
2. Promote the Religious Peace Academy (RPA) as a platform for learning, understanding, and cooperation among different religions
3. Strengthen interfaith harmony by highlighting shared values that transcend religious and cultural differences
4. Encourage youth leadership and civic participation in advancing sustainable peace initiatives
5. Reinforce a culture of peace through education, dialogue, and collective action

■ CONCLUSION

The 12th Anniversary of January 24 HWPL Peace Day serves as a call to action for the youth to rise as builders of peace and unity. Through the Religious Peace Academy, young people are empowered with knowledge, values, and dialogue that transcend differences and foster mutual respect.
