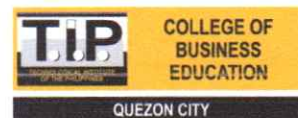

IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS (IRR)

6th SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL COMPETITION, ABM Edition

January 28, 2026, Wednesday,

8:00 AM - 4:00 PM

T.I.P. Manila

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IRR 1.0 Event Objectives

The 6th Senior High School Competition aims to:

IRR 1.1 Promote excellence among Senior High School students under the Accounting and Business Management strand of both private and public schools offering junior high schools.

IRR 1.2 Develop the analytical and critical-thinking skills of Senior High School students in topics related to Basic and Applied Economics, Basic Mathematics, Basic Finance, Entrepreneurship, Principles of Marketing and Management, Fundamentals of Accounting, and Current Events.

IRR 1.3 Discover the strengths and weaknesses of students and encourage them to pursue the Business and Accounting Program.

IRR 1.4 Build and promote camaraderie among the participants through a competitive but fun and interactive competition.

IRR 2.0 Intended Learning Outcomes

At the end of the activity, students will be able to:

IRR 2.1 Showcase their individual and collaborative skills in both physical and mental aspects throughout and after the competition;

IRR 2.2 Improve skills in answering questions with time pressure on topics related to the ABM course subjects: Applied Economics, Business Mathematics, Principles of Marketing, Business Finance, Fundamentals of Accounting, and Business Ethics and Social Responsibility.

IRR 2.3 Identify areas for improvement along the different topics related to strengthening knowledge in Accounting and Business Management.

IRR 2.4 Build relationships and camaraderie with other participants.

IRR 3.0 General Qualifications

IRR 3.1 All contestants must be bona fide Grade 12 Senior High School Students.

IRR 3.2 Each high school may send **one (1) team with five (5) members. One (1) coach** should accompany the team to represent the school.

IRR 4.0 Coverage

IRR 4.1 The 4th Senior High School Competition shall be composed of **two (2) segments**.

- i. Tycoon's Quiz Show
- ii. Amazing Race

IRR 4.2 The Tycoon's Quiz Show shall cover the following AMB core subjects:

1. Applied Economics
2. Business Math
3. Principles of Marketing
4. Organization and Management
5. Business Finance
6. Fundamentals of Accounting
7. Business Ethics and Social Responsibility

IRR 4.2 The Amazing Race shall comprise Team Building Activities in six (6) different stations.

IRR 5.0 Tycoon's Quiz Show Rules and Mechanics

IRR 5.1

Quiz Bee Proper

- The quiz bee shall be composed of **three (3) levels: Easy, Average, and Difficult.**

Round	Points Per Question	Number Of Quiz Bee Questions	Highest Possible Score per Level
Easy	1	10	10
Average	2	10	20
Difficult	3	10	30
Total Score =			60

- Contestants should strictly observe health protocols and maintain proper decorum during the contest proper.
- Each team will have an assigned usher/facilitator.
- We encourage participants to use a tablet; however, a mobile phone is also acceptable. The use of laptops or other devices not mentioned is strictly prohibited.
- Each team will also be provided with a board, marker, scratch papers & pencils. Each team shall bring their own **non-programmable scientific calculator / basic calculator.**
- The competition will be conducted on Quizizz.**
- A unique game PIN will be provided** for each round, which teams must enter to join.
- The Quizmasters will read the question.
- Questions will be displayed on the main screen, and answers will be submitted using the team's chosen mobile phone.
- Each question will have a time limit (e.g., 30 seconds). Teams must answer within the given time to earn points. Faster correct answers earn more points.
- After each round, the scores will be presented to all participants to ensure transparency and fairness in the competition.
- Internet connection will be provided specifically for the competition by the Information Technology Service Office (ITSO). The dedicated internet network will ensure stable connectivity for all participants. Participants are instructed to connect only to the designated network to avoid interruptions.
- In case of a technical problem that may result in teams being unable to use Quizizz,** the contestants should **write their answer on the board/bond paper** and show it to the proctor assigned to their team before the allotted time ends.
- After the allotted time has ended for a given item, the Quiz Master will give a cue for the proctors to raise their flags. **A yellow flag means that the team got the correct answer, while a black flag means that the team would like to clarify or advance a dispute.** The proctor assigned to each team shall record the team's scores.
- In the event of a tie, a sudden-death round will be held with one difficult question. The fastest correct answer wins.
- Participants must not switch devices or share answers with other teams.
- Any team found using more than one device will be disqualified.

IRR 5.2

Board of Judges

- Each member of the Board of Judges shall be a professor who specializes in the subjects being covered in this quiz bee for the purpose of giving an intelligent and independent decision. The Board of Judges shall have the sole and exclusive authority to clear or answer any protests/clarifications raised by the contestants.

IRR 6.0 Amazing Race Rules and Mechanics

IRR 6.1

Amazing Race Proper

- All participants are required to join the Amazing Race challenge.
- Participants will be given a **race kit**, an **amazing race card**, and any specific materials needed for the race.
- All group members will start with a score of zero. They need to earn points at each station.
- Each station is clearly labeled from Station 1 to Station 5 to guide participants.
- Participants must proceed to each station in sequential order (e.g., Station 1, then Station 2, and so on). Skipping stations is not allowed.
- Before moving to the next station, the Amazing Race card must be filled out first.
- No participants will be eliminated unless the team surrenders or decides not to finish the race. In such cases, the team will earn no points, even if they have accumulated points from previous stations.
- Further mechanics for every station shall be given to the respective coaches on the day of the competition.

IRR 7.0 Violations and Warnings

IRR 7.1 Failure to follow the instructions stated in this IRR for the first (1st) time shall merit the contestant/team a **warning**; for the second (2nd) time, a **decrease of 10 points to their total score**. A third violation shall automatically **disqualify** the said contestant/team from the competition.

IRR 7.2 All the materials in the event are deemed confidential. Contestants are strictly prohibited from copying, picturing, or taking screenshots of any of the questions and other materials throughout the competition. Event facilitator members shall be in charge of monitoring the said offenses. Their decision shall be binding and irrevocable.

IRR 7.3 In case of any concern, clarification, or protest that is not governed by the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), the Project Heads of this event shall have the absolute power to decide on matters that they deem necessary to preserve and protect the integrity of the competition. Their decisions are final and irrevocable.

IRR 8.0 Declaration of Winners

IRR 8.1 The committee shall provide an official tabulation of scores during the quiz bee and Amazing Race. Any discrepancies with the points shall be directed to the committee-in-charge for verification during the event.

IRR 8.2 Total accumulated points from the quiz bee and Amazing Race will be the basis for ranking. The team that garnered the highest points will be declared the Champion. In case there is a tie, a clincher round in the quiz bee will be provided to break the tie.

IRR 8.3

The decisions of the judges are final and irrevocable.

IRR 9.0 Prizes

IRR 9.1 All participants shall be awarded a certificate of participation.

IRR 9.2 Prizes are the following for each team:

- 1st Prize – 100% tuition fee discount for 1st-year college + ₱ 4,000 Cash + Medal + Plaque + Certificate of Recognition
- 2nd Prize – 75% tuition fee discount for 1st-year college + ₱ 3,000 Cash + Medal + Plaque + Certificate of Recognition
- 3rd Prize – 50% tuition fee discount for 1st-year college + ₱ 2,000 Cash + Medal + Plaque + Certificate of Recognition
