MONITORING OF THE CONDUCT OF THE NATIONAL LEARNING CAMP (NLC) FOR THE END OF SCHOOL YEAR (EOSY) 2022-2023

- To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendents Chief- Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) Chief- School Governance and Operations Division (SGOD) Public Schools District Supervisors Public Secondary School Heads All Others Concerned
 - 1. Pursuant to DepEd Order No. 014 s. 2023 titled Policy Guidelines on the Implementation of National Learning Camp, this Office, through the Curriculum Implementation Division conducted a series of Orientation and Capacity Building relative to its implementation.
 - 2. Anent to it, the Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) Personnel with the support of School Governance and Operations Division (SGOD) are enjoined to monitor the program within the period of its implementation from July 24 to August 25, 2023 and provision of technical assistance if deemed necessary.
 - 3. Attached are the enclosures of the assigned monitors and the monitoring and evaluation tool to be used in the actual visit of the school. The EPS-Monitors shall coordinate with the PSDS and School Heads regarding their schedule of visit. The result of monitoring shall be submitted to Emerson B. Dalangin as the Division Focal Person of NLC for consolidation and analysis.
 - 4. The SGOD thru its School Management Monitoring and Evaluation Section shall be in-charge in the over-all collection of data to be accomplished by the school heads in the form of e-tool to be provided later thru PSDS on the 2nd week of its implementation.
 - 5. In the school level, school heads are directed to monitor and evaluate the implementation to support the teachers with high attention to the protection and safety of the learners.





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- 6. The transportation expenses of the monitors shall be charged against SDO MOOE subject to usual accounting and auditing procedures.
- 7. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
