BASED ASSESSMENT**

DATE : November 29, 2024

The Two-Week Upgrading of Essential Digital Skills for Learners on ICT-Based Assessment aims to provide an opportunity for learners to strengthen the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and behaviors in using digital devices that they acquired inside the classroom through intensive hands-on experience in tackling ICT-based assessment. Further, this hands-on opportunity would aid learners in demonstrating their skills in a controlled task, which includes a structured accomplishment of assessment tasks anchored on the grade-level competencies. This two-week activity will be conducted on **December 2-6 and 9-13, 2024**, intended for Grade 9 and 10 learners.

The Department of Education, through the Bureau of Learning Delivery of the Curriculum and Teaching Strand, allocates **Thirty Million, Seventy-Six Thousand, Two Hundred Pesos (Php 30,076,200.00)** to support the aforementioned activity. This memorandum ensures appropriate utilization of the Program Support Funds (PSF).

The funds shall be downloaded to the Regional Offices (ROs). When deemed more economical and cost-efficient, the RO may sub-allot to the Schools Division Offices (SDOs) and implementing unit schools.





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The implementation of this two-week activity shall be charged against the **FY 2024 (R.A. 11975) Basic Education Curriculum (BEC) Funds**, subject to the existing budgeting, accounting, auditing, and procurement rules and regulations.

The sole eligible expenditure to be funded by the PSF to be downloaded **meals at Php 90.00 per day per learner for 10 days, good for 154 Grade 9 and 10 learners**, to support the implementation of this activity, subject to the limitation of funds. This is to ensure maximum learner attendance and full engagement for the duration of the activity.

The table below shows the total allocation per RO based on the number of SDOs, which is intended for one (1) secondary school that meets the criteria in paragraph 8. It also shows the school allocation for 154 Grade 9 and 10 learners with a Php 90.00 allocation per day, good for 10 days.

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Procurement of resources under these guidelines shall be in accordance with applicable provisions of RA 9184 and its IRR as well as the internal rules and processes of DepEd.

In case the downloaded fund is not sufficient to address the actual needs for the purpose, the ROs and SDOs may provide additional fund support from local funds or may venture into partnerships compliant with DepEd accounting rules and regulations.

To ensure the smooth conduct of the activity, all Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD) Chiefs, Regional Supervisors for English, Science, and Mathematics, and Regional Information Technology Officers (ITOs) must attend the online orientation. The date and time of the orientation will be announced at a later date. Participants can access the online meeting through the following link: <https://bit.ly/Orientation-DigitizedLearners>.

The ROs are expected to conduct an online orientation for SDOs and public secondary schools on the use of the Digitized Learner's Guide and formative assessment tool prior to the conduct of the activity. *(See attached program matrix)*

Both the ROs and SDOs are tasked with conducting monitoring and evaluation activities to ensure compliance with the standards and procedures of the digital skills upgrading activity.

The ROs should submit the activity report to include the utilization of funds in the one drive link provided by the NTWG of the Bureau of Learning Delivery - Teaching and Learning Division (BLD-TLD). The deadline for the submission of the activity report is set a week after the conduct of the activity.
