- Relative to Presidential Proclamation No. 470, s. 2003 titled "Declaring the Third Saturday of September of Each Year as the International Coastal CleanUp (ICC) Day in Observance of the Global Coastal Clean-Up Celebrations," this Office hereby enjoins all sub-offices to coordinate with their respective Local Government Units (LGUs) in the conduct of a Coastal Cleanup/Cleanup Activity simultaneously on September 20, 2025.
- 2. This activity aims to engage local communities through collaborative cleanup efforts, fostering a sense of ownership and shared responsibility for coastal preservation.
- SDO personnel and concerned individuals are encouraged to join the LGU activity nearest to the location where the activity may take place.
- 4. All concerned are further directed to ensure the proper documentation of the activity and to submit an accomplishment report indicating, at a minimum, the total number of volunteers, the total estimated weight of debris removed, and the estimated distance covered (in kilometers).
- 5. Attachment are: Presidential Proclamation 470 issued on September 15, 2003, e-copies of the Ocean Trash Data Form and other materials for the cleanup.

The International Coastal Cleanup Philippines recommends the following guidelines to safely conduct your cleanup:

- 1. Conduct group cleanup in locations in cooperation/coordination with the local government unit (Barangay LGU) and/or the City / Municipal government. Marine debris originates from land which goes to the sewers, waterways (esteros, rivers and to the sea).
- 2. There is no need to go far to the shoreline or beach to clean but in your neighborhood: community, schools, homes, businesses and work surroundings. We clean up the neighborhood before the trash/debris goes into the storm drain or sewers.
- 3. As an alternative to trash data recording on the Volunteers / Coordinator Ocean Trash Data Form, you can download and use Clean Swell, a free mobile phone app available in Google Play or App Store to record debris items.
- 4. All results must be recorded using the Ocean Data Form (for volunteers) and Ocean Data Summary Form (Coordinators). Send by email at: iccphilippines@gmail.com or online at ICC Philippines, Inc. website.
- 5. Visit the ICC Philippines website and download all information, advisory/guidelines and materials, etc.

PROCLAMATION NO. 470

DECLARING THE THIRD SATURDAY OF SEPTEMBER OF EACH YEAR AS THE INTERNATIONAL COASTAL CLEAN-UP (ICC) DAY IN OBSERVANCE OF THE GLOBAL COASTAL CLEAN-UP CELEBRATIONS

WHEREAS, the International Coastal Clean-up (ICC) is a global initiative since 1986 by The Ocean Conservancy (TOC), formerly the Center for Manne Conservation (CMC), a Non-Government Organization based in Washington, D.C., USA, together with Environment Protection Agency (EPA);

WHEREAS, the ICC is the largest volunteer effort for the environment and is held every Third Saturday of September of every year in over 100 countries and 54 U.S. states and territories;

WHEREAS, the Philippines joined the ICC in 1994 with the International Marinelife Alliance (IMA) as the country coordinator and more than 3,000 volunteers cleaned the shorelines and underwater sites and since 1998, the Philippines has consistently topped the ICC, in terms of volunteer turnout and has been recognized as "the clean-up capital of the world";

WHEREAS. Information collected during the International Coastal Cleanup is used to educate people and create solutions to the problems of solid waste, and litter in our coastal areas;

WHEREAS, it is impuriant that we protect our coastal and marine areas as 80% of Filipinos depend on fish for their protein requirements;

WHEREAS through partnerships with government, environment groups and citizens, this very important process is gradually changing behaviors and practices that create debris;

WHEREAS, Republic Act 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act" was signed into law in 2001 and is a significant positive action in dealing with the debris problem in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, there is a need to declare an ICC day to remind and reawaken our people for vigilance in support for the continuing crusade against the





debns crisis all over the world - a united front for all "citizens of the world" to keep Mother Earth clean.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GLORIA MACAPAGAL-ARROYO, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby declare every third Saturday of September of each year as the *International Coastal Clean up Day*, consistent with Presidential Proclamation No 244 declaring September as National Clean-up Month.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the Republic of the Philippines to be affixed.

DONE in the City of Manila, this *15th* day of September, in the year of Our Lord, Two Thousand and Three.
