# JINGLE WRITING CONTEST "Himig MAKABATA"

#### CONTEST RULES AND MECHANICS

#### 1. ELIGIBILITY

- The contest is open to children and youth aged 13 to 17 years. Both in-school
  and out-of-school children/youth may participate in the contest.
- Participation may be individual or in groups of up to three (3) members. Each group will be treated as one contestant under a collective name.
- Individuals with professional experience in songwriting, music production, or audio engineering are not eligible to join.

#### 2 THEME

- Entries must creatively express
- The importance of child rights, protection, and empowerment; and
- The MAKABATA Helpline 1383 as a critical reporting and referral mechanism for child protection concerns.

#### T CATECODIES

There will be one contest category open to all eligible participants, whether
in-school or out-of-school-regardless of grade or school level, as long as they
meet the ane requirement.

#### 4. JINGLE SPECIFICATIONS

- a. The jingle must be an original composition (lyrics and melody), created solely by the participant/s.
- b. Lyrics may be in Filipino, English, or a combination of both
- a. The lingle must be lively, memorable, and relevant to the thems
- d. Any genre is allowed.
- a. Duration must be between 60 to 90 seconds
- The lyrics must be appropriate for all audiences. Entries containing offensive or inappropriate content will be disqualified.
- a. Any musical instrument may be used.
- Entries must be submitted in WAV format.
- Each submission must include the fyrics and a brief explanation (3–6 sentences)
  of the message behind the jingle.

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
